
ORDER GRANTING GOVERNMENT'S MOTION TO DISMISS

This matter comes before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) as a Show Cause Hearing in Case No. 15-CMP-01011 against Alexander Market, Inc., t/a Newton Food Mart (Respondent).


At the Show Cause Hearing, the District of Columbia (Government) moved the Board to dismiss the case because there is a lack of evidence to support the charge. Upon the Government's review, it was determined that there was not sufficient evidence to prove the alleged violation of no ABC-licensed manager on duty.

For these reasons, on this 8th day of June 2016, the Board hereby **GRANTS** the Government's Motion and **DISMISSES** Case No. 15-CMP-01011 against the Respondent. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent and the Government.



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
