3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The
4 next case on our calendar is Case No. 18-CMP-
5 00329, Panda Gourmet, License No. 86961.

6 Would the parties, please, approach
7 and identify themselves for the record, please?

8 MR. ADAMS: Good morning, Mr.
9 Chairman. Walter Adams representing the District
10 of Columbia.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Adams.

12 MR. JONES: Good morning, Mr.
13 Anderson, Mr. Chairman. Mark Jones, General
14 Manager for T & L Investment Group.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
16 Mr. Jones.

17 Mr. Adams, are there any preliminary
18 matters in this case?

19 MR. ADAMS: There is a preliminary
20 matter in this case, Mr. Chairman. The parties
21 have discussed this case for a single charge of
22 the establishment not having an ABC Manager. And

1 they have -- the parties have agreed to an Offer
2 in Compromise that we would like to propose to
3 the Board, that the establishment pay a fine of
4 \$2,000 within a 60 day period and if they fail to
5 pay that fine within that 60 day period, the
6 license will be suspended indefinitely until the
7 fine is paid.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jones, it's
9 my understanding there is an Offer in Compromise
10 and the Offer in Compromise is that there is a
11 \$2,000 fine payable within 60 days. If the fine
12 is not payable in 60 days, the license will be
13 suspended.

14 Is this your understanding, sir, of
15 the Offer in Compromise?

16 MR. JONES: Yes, sir.

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you aware
18 that by accepting the Offer in Compromise, that
19 you are giving up your right to a hearing?

20 MR. JONES: I do.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you also
22 aware that by accepting an Offer in Compromise,

1 that you are giving up your right to appeal this
2 matter?

3 MR. JONES: I do.

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: With that said,
5 I make a motion that the Offer in Compromise of a
6 fine of \$2,000 payable in 60 days be accepted.
7 If the fine is not payable in 60 days, the
8 license will be suspended until the fine has been
9 paid. Is there a second?

10 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
12 seconded the motion.

13 All those in favor say aye.

14 ALL: Aye.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Those opposed?
16 The matter passed 7-0-0.

17 Now that this case is over, Mr. Jones,
18 this is the fifth secondary tier violation. And
19 if I remember correctly, this is probably the
20 third week in a row that I have seen you and I'm
21 not quite sure. This Agency offers books and
22 records training, sir.

1 I don't know what is going on, but I
2 don't understand why this company, this is the
3 fifth secondary tier violation in four years. It
4 appears that it is going on, so this Agency
5 offers books and records training and if your
6 establishment needs assistance in how to fill --
7 how to do -- comply with the law, we stand ready
8 and able to assist you, sir.

9 MR. JONES: Okay.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.

11 MR. JONES: I understand.

12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

13 Thank you. We will have you sign-off on this
14 paper.
