
recreation centers, day care centers, and public libraries;” (5) ability to attract schools-age children before, during, and after school; or (6) creation of an “overconcentration of licensed establishments.” D.C. Code § 25-313 (2004); D.C. Code § 25-314 (2007), 23 DCMR § 400 (2008). Instead, the Protestant claims only violations of the voluntary agreement, which are not covered by the protest appropriateness standard. The Protestant may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

ORDER

The Board does hereby, this 8th day of December, 2010, **DISMISS** the Protest of Dominick Cardella. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Applicant and Protestant.






