
**ORDER ON PRAECIPE OF DISMISSAL**

On May 16, 2016, the District of Columbia (Government) filed a Praecipe of Dismissal seeking dismissal of the charges listed in the Notice to Show Cause Hearing filed against MPE Hotel I (Georgetown), LLC, t/a Ritz Carlton Georgetown (Respondent), in Case Number 15-CMP-00513. *See* ABRA Show Cause File No. 15-CMP-00513.

The Government seeks to dismiss the charges because the Respondent's License was transferred. Specially, on January 13, 2016, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) approved the transfer of the Respondent's license to a new owner. In addition, on April 27, 2016, the Board issued a new license number to the new owner.

For these reasons, on this 18<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2016, the Board hereby **ACKNOWLEDGES** receipt of the Government's Praecipe of Dismissal and **DISMISSES** Case No. 15-CMP-00513 against the Respondent. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent and the Government.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
