**ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF PROTEST OF
A GROUP OF FIVE OR MORE INDIVIDUALS**

The Application filed by CS Bond St. AB-S Holdings, LLC, t/a Savoy Suites Hotel, for a Substantial Change for an additional Summer Garden, Entertainment Endorsement for the Summer Garden, and expansion of its interior seating capacity, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on August 24, 2015, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001).

On August 24, 2015, the Board dismissed the Group of Five or More Individuals because only one member of the group signed the protest letter. The remaining sixteen (16) members of the group listed on the Protest did not sign the protest letter. Pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1605.3, all protests shall be signed by the protestant and shall contain the protestant's full name and mailing address. *See also* 23 DCMR § 1801.2(f) (requiring that the printed name and address of each petitioner, accompanied by his or her handwritten signature). Sixteen (16) of seventeen (17) individuals merely printed their names but did not sign the protest letter.

The Protestants may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

ORDER

The Board does hereby, this 9th day of September, 2015, **DISMISS** the Protest of the Group of Five or More Individuals. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Applicant, ANC 3B, ANC 3C, and Paul Cunningham, on behalf of the Group of Five or More Individuals.

The Board advises the parties that the protests of ANC 3B and ANC 3C remain, and the Protest Status Hearing is set for October 14, 2015 at 9:30 a.m. and the Protest Hearing for November 18, 2015 at 1:30 p.m.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433, any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
