3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,  
4 everyone. I would like to welcome you to the  
5 regularly scheduled meeting of the District of  
6 Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.  
7 Please know that today's hearings will be  
8 conducted in accordance with D.C. Official Code  
9 Section 2-574 of the Open Meetings Act.

10 Today is April 24, 2019. I would like to  
11 introduce Members of the Board with us today.

12 To my far right is Mr. Bobby Cato. To  
13 my immediate right is Mr. Nick Alberti. To my  
14 far left is Ms. Rema Wahabzadah. To her right is  
15 Mr. Mike Silverstein and to my immediate left is  
16 Mr. James Short. My name is Donovan Anderson.  
17 I'm the Chairman of the Board. We have six  
18 Members in attendance today for the conduct of  
19 business and so we do have a quorum.

20 I would like to mention two things  
21 before we first get started. If you have any  
22 electronic devices, pagers or such, please, turn

1       them off to avoid any interruption of the  
2       proceeding.

3               Secondly, there is a piece of paper on  
4       each table. When you come forward as your name  
5       is called, please, take a seat at the table and,  
6       please, sign-in. This is to ensure the correct  
7       spelling of your name for the record.

8               Additionally, when you introduce  
9       yourself for the record, please, spell your name  
10      aloud for the court reporter.

11              I would note that the approximate time  
12      is 9:37 a.m.

13              Our first order of business today is  
14      our Show Cause Hearing (Status). The first case  
15      is Case No. 18-AUD-00109, Sing Sing Karaoke,  
16      License No. 72783.

17              Would the parties, please, approach  
18      and identify themselves for the record, please?

19              MS. KRUPKE: Good morning. Jessica  
20      Krupke on behalf of the Government.

21              CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,  
22      Ms. Krupke.

1 MR. MARTIN: Jason Martin, owner.

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,  
3 Mr. Martin.

4 MR. MARTIN: Good morning.

5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are there --  
6 good morning. Are there any preliminary matters  
7 in this case?

8 MS. KRUPKE: Yes, there are. The  
9 parties have an Offer in Compromise.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is  
11 that?

12 MS. KRUPKE: The fine of \$2,000 would  
13 be paid within 30 days or the license shall be  
14 suspended indefinitely until the fine is paid and  
15 the licensee will submit all pending quarterly  
16 statements, if they have not yet been submitted.

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is there any  
18 time line for them to submit, if there is any  
19 outstanding? I'm just asking. I'm not a part of  
20 it. I was just asking for clarification.

21 MS. KRUPKE: I don't believe that a  
22 time line was attached to the 30 days to submit

1 the quarterly statements. I believe the 30 days  
2 was just for pay -- to pay the \$2,000, but the  
3 Government would be amenable to the same time  
4 line being attached to the requirement to submit  
5 the quarterly statements, if they have not yet  
6 been submitted.

7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. All  
8 right. Mr. Martin, it's my understanding that  
9 there is an Offer in Compromise and the Offer in  
10 Compromise is that there is a fine of \$2,000  
11 payable within 30 days. If the fine is not  
12 payable within 30 days -- it is 30 days, right?

13 MS. KRUPKE: (No audible answer.)

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What was the  
15 time period, 30 days?

16 If the fine is not payable within 30  
17 days, the license will be suspended until the  
18 fine has been paid. And if -- at the same time,  
19 if there is any outstanding reports, that these  
20 outstanding reports are filed.

21 Is this your understanding, sir, of  
22 the Offer in Compromise?

1 MR. MARTIN: Is it 30 days from  
2 today's date?

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It would be 30  
4 days from the date that -- yes, if that's the  
5 agreement. You tell me what the agreement is and  
6 I don't --

7 MR. MARTIN: One year.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, I don't  
9 think -- well, I'm not in the negotiation, that's  
10 a negotiation between you and the Government. So  
11 the Government tells me what the agreement is.  
12 The Board will vote yes or no, so that's between  
13 you and her.

14 MR. MARTIN: 30 days is fine.

15 MS. KRUPKE: Yes.

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

17 MS. KRUPKE: Yes, the agreement was  
18 made for 30 days.

19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So  
20 you understand that there is a fine of \$2,000  
21 payable in 30 days. If the fine is not payable  
22 in 30 days, the license will be suspended until

1 the fine has been paid. And all outstanding  
2 reports, if have not been filed, would be filed.

3 Is this your understanding, sir, of  
4 the Offer in Compromise?

5 MR. MARTIN: Yes.

6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you aware  
7 that by accepting an Offer in Compromise, that  
8 you are giving up your right to a hearing?

9 MR. MARTIN: Yes.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And are you  
11 also aware that by accepting an Offer in  
12 Compromise, that you are giving up your right to  
13 appeal this matter?

14 MR. MARTIN: Yes.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: With that said,  
16 I then make a motion that the Offer in Compromise  
17 of a fine of \$2,000 payable in 30 days be  
18 accepted, that any outstanding reports will also  
19 be filed within the period of time. If the fine  
20 is not payable in 30 days, the license will be  
21 suspended until the fine has been paid.

22 Is there a second?

1                   MEMBER SHORT:   Second.

2                   CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON:   Mr. Short has  
3   seconded the motion.

4                   All those in favor say aye.

5                   ALL:   Aye.

6                   CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON:   Those opposed?  
7   The matter passed 6-0-0.

8                   Thank you.   So once you sign this,  
9   sir, Mr. Martin, you have some paperwork to sign.  
10   And so the 30 days starts from today, sir, once  
11   you sign that paper work.   Thank you very much.

12                   (Whereupon, the Show Cause (Status)  
13   Hearing was concluded at 9:39 a.m.)
