ORDER VACATING CEASE AND DESIST


On November 4, 2015, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued Board Order No. 2015-502 ordering Sixth and H Street Bar and Grill, LLC, t/a Sixth and H Street Bar and Grill (Respondent), holder of a Retailer's Class CT License No. ABRA-096761, to stop selling, serving, or permitting the consumption of alcoholic beverages at its establishment until payment of the third year license fees and any associated fines are received by ABRA.

On November 6, 2015, the Respondent paid the license fees for the period of 2015 to 2016 and the associated late fees.


It is hereby **ORDERED**, that the **ORDER TO CEASE AND DESIST** issued against Sixth and H Street Bar and Grill, LLC, t/a Sixth and H Street Bar and Grill, located at 523 H Street, N.E., Washington, D.C., by the Board on November 4, 2015, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), be and hereby is **VACATED**.



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
