The Application filed by Alamac, Inc. t/a The River Inn/Dish, for a Substantial Change (Sidewalk Café with 28 Seats) to its Retailer's Class CH License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on April 13, 2015, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001).


On April 13, 2015, the Board dismissed the Group of Five or more individuals because only one person from the Group of Five (Monica Martinez) appeared for the Roll Call Hearing, and the other members of the Group of Five failed to appear or designate a representative to

appear on their behalf, as required by DCMR § 1602.2. The Group of Five Individuals may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

ORDER

The Board does hereby, this 6th day of May, 2015, **DISMISS** the Protest of the Group of Five Individuals. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Applicant, the ANC and the Group of Five Individuals.



Pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 (2008), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, NW, 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. *See* D.C. App. Rule 15(b).
