**ORDER GRANTING GOVERNMENT'S MOTION TO DISMISS**

This matter comes before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) as a Show Cause Status Hearing in Case Nos. 15-CMP-00325 and 15-CMP-00846 against Partners at 723 8th St SE, LLC, t/a The Ugly Mug Dining Saloon (Respondent).

At the Show Cause Status Hearing, the District of Columbia (Government) moved the Board to dismiss the cases because the Respondent paid the citations that formed the basis of the charges listed in the Show Cause Notices. Specially, the Respondent paid \$2,000.00 on March 29, 2016, to satisfy the amount owed for Citation Nos. 4432 and 5230.

For these reasons, on this 6<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2016, the Board hereby **GRANTS** the Government's Motion and **DISMISSES** Case Nos. 15-CMP-00325 and 15-CMP-00846 against the Respondent. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent and the Government.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
